Concurrent Enrollment Program

Arkansas State University-Newport is excited about our Concurrent Enrollment Program! Students are encouraged to apply for admission anytime after their sophomore year of high school. Once admitted, we hope you will take full advantage of this unique opportunity to learn.

Concurrent Enrollment is designed for students with above average academic ability and achievement. Individuals may be admitted to ASU-Newport and enroll in college courses while completing high school.

A permanent college record is established once students are admitted to the program and begin to take classes. Typical course offerings include English, political science (government), psychology, history, biology, health sciences, college algebra and art.

Admission Policy for Concurrently Enrolled Students

Concurrently enrolled applicants are those students who:

- are currently enrolled in a high school program,
- have a minimum 2.5 grade point average,
- have a minimum score of 19 on the ACT subtests if they are enrolled in an English or math course and, are recommended by their high school principal or counselor.

Admission Procedures for Concurrent Enrollment Students

To ensure full consideration, all admissions application materials should contain the following items:

- A completed ASU-Newport *Application for Admission to the Concurrent Enrollment Program*,
- The Principal or Counselor's recommendation letter,
- An official high school transcript reflecting classes in progress, and
- Official SAT or ACT scores.

Additional Procedures for Concurrent Enrollment

- All students are subject to all applicable ACT requirements.
- All students must submit an Immunization Record to *Admissions and Records* prior to attending classes.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Who should enroll in a concurrently offered course?

A: Anyone who is in high school and ...

- preparing for college or other institutions of higher education
- wondering if they can complete college level work

Q: What are the benefits?

A: The benefits of Concurrent Enrollment are numerous:

- Investigate courses of study before enrolling in a degree program
- Earn transferable credit towards a Bachelor or Associate degree
- Cost of participation is reasonable
- Study under the guidance of outstanding faculty

Q: When are classes offered?

A: Concurrent courses are offered during the fall and spring semesters. Most courses are offered during the regular high school hours. While some institutions may have the ability to offer coursework during the evening or on Saturday.

Course Fees

Q: What are the fees?

A: Fees are determined according to the number of units offered.

Tuition for a one semester credit hour course is \$76.00. Most courses carry 3 semester hours of credit. This translates into tuition of \$228.00. Some schools have made special arrangements to reduce the student's costs.

Fees are periodically adjusted and are subject to change without notice. Additional fees may be charged if your class requires lab time or if you enroll past the accepted deadline.

Transferable Credits

Q: Are all credits transferable?

A: Concurrent units are transferable to most academic institutions. Since the receiving institution determines acceptability of credit earned, students should consult with the receiving institution.
