# Technical Certificate in Paramedic

The Paramedic program is designed to produce skilled paramedics for pre-hospital care and transportation. Paramedic graduates are eligible to take the \*National Registry EMT Paramedic Certification Examination. Enrollment: Maximum 20 students per instructor.

The paramedic program is accredited by The Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP). CAAHEP recognizes the program's compliance with the nationally established accreditation standards. Accreditation standards are established by CAAHEP and American Academy of Pediatrics, American College of Cardiology, American College of Emergency



## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

1. Submit completed application
2. Current TB Test
3. Tetanus Shot within last eight (8) years
4. Two MMR's
5. Negative drug screen (administered at ASUTC by independent lab)
6. Must have COMPASS scores of 38+ in English, 36+ in Math, and 83+ in Reading (COMPASS) scores can not be over five years old)
7. Must have HCP, CPR, and Current Arkansas EMT Certification
8. Official High School Transcript or GED and official transcripts of all post-secondary education



Physicians, American College of Osteopathic Emergency Physicians, American College of Surgeons, American Society of Anesthesiologists, National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians, National Association of State EMS Directors, National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians, the National Association of EMS Educators and The Arkansas Department of Health, Office of EMS and Trauma Systems.

The Arkansas Department of Health, Office of EMS and Trauma Systems requires an individual to successfully complete 701 hours of theory and 675 hours of clinical hours in order to qualify to take the National Registry EMT/Paramedic Certification Examination.
